- Gavrilă NEAMŢ/G. G. NEAMŢU (born in 1945) PhD in Philology (1977), University Professor (1999-2011), PhD supervisor in Philology Romanian contemporary language (from 2007), Emeritus Professor (2011-), at the Department of Romanian Language and General Linguistics, Faculty of Letters, Babeş-Bolyai University, from 2015 to 2018, invited professor at the same Department.
- G. G. Neamţu is part of the old and distinguished generation of **The post-war grammar school** of Romanian contemporary language from Cluj (together with M. Zdrenghea, D. D. Draşoveanu, G. Gruiţă, Şt. Hazi, V. Hodiş ş.a.), he is an iconic name of this generation, having given its name: *The school of neo-traditional relational grammar/ syntagmatical relational grammar*.
- Almost all of his work as a professional grammarian deals with this conceptual area, an approach that is successfully passed on to the young/very young grammarians from Cluj (former students, master students, former and current PhD students), thus carrying on a tradition of over fifty years.
- As a professor, he has taught fundamental courses both at undergraduate level (*Phonetics and phonology, Morphology, Syntax* the latter, as D. D. Draşoveanu's successor, is taught by him even today) and at master level (*The grammatical individuality of Romanian language among Romance languages*, taught at present, and *Controversial Morphosyntax Issues of Contemporary Romanian Language*, both within the framework of the Master's programme *Romanian Language in the Context of Romance Languages*, whose founder and first director he was). In recent years, as an/a invited/retired professor, he teaches the optional course *Morphosyntactic news in GALR 2005/2008 and GBLR 2010*.
- Like most of Cluj's grammarians from his generation, G. G. Neamţu has mostly conducted individual research, having been part of larger collectives in national projects/research grants only seldom and by accident.
- Areas of interest / research areas that he has approached are mostly related to the practical and the educational, and, also, subordinated to them. They are connected almost exclusively to contemporary Romanian language grammar and its controversial issues, approached from the point of view of neo-traditional relational grammar. (Hence a certain disputatious spirit regarding mainstream opinions.)
- Among the relevant and relatively well-known contributions to this field (personal ideas, adjusted ideas, contested or enlarged ones, theoretical and analytical approaches etc.) the most remarkable ones refer to the following segments: predicativitatea, the relation between predicate and subject, the categorical-relational classification of the adjunct, the "questions" in the metalanguage of grammar analysis, the phrase analysis techniques, the article and the way determiners work (determinarea), non-personal verbal forms (supin and participiu), the morphosyntax of the semi-independent possessive pronoun al (a, ai, ale, ale), the morphosyntax of the possessive adjective, pronominal adjectives de întărire, relative (interrogative) words exclamatives, disjunctive coordination, the accusative of time, the "atypical" adverbs (adverbial phrases), defective constructions (preposition + adjective), the neuter, the cumultative relative, double subordination, causal form vs. procausal forms, the semi-independent/semi-nouns nouns, "diathesis", the zero subject, the morphematic structure of pronouns, ambivalences vs. distinctions in the grammatical analysis etc.

- With such a prodigious list of interests, G. G. Neamţu is undoubtedly one of the most referenced grammarians of Cluj in the last twenty years, be it in studies, articles, major works, recent academic treatises, published or unpublished PhD theses.
- He is a member in various editorial comittees of journals such as: Studia Universitatis Babeş-Bolyai, Philologia Cluj-Napoca, Studia Universitatis Petru Maior, Series Philologia Târgu Mureş, Buletin Ştiinţific, philological section, The North University of Baia Mare, Dacoromania (The "Sextil Puşcariu" Institute of Linguistics and Literary History of the Romanian Academy, the Cluj-Napoca branch), Perspective. Journal of Didactics of Romanian Language and Literature, Cluj Napoca.
- On April 1st 2002, the President of Romania awards professor Neamţu *The National Order* For Merit. At the age of seventy, a massive homage volume (of 800 pages) is dedicated to him: *To and from Cluj. Linguistic constributions* (Cluj-Napoca, Scriptor and Argonaut publishing house, 2015), a volume whose contributors are prestigious Romanian linguists from most universities in the country.
- In recent years, in addition to teaching and research, G. G. Neamţu is particularly involved in supervising PhD students and promoting young grammarians (through referrals and letters of recommandation towards publication of their own works).
- As a grammar specialist, he was involved as a scientific counselor in numerous comitees at public defences of doctoral theses (Cluj-Napoca, Bucureşti, Baia Mare, Arad) and in addition, until his retirement, in committees for the occupation of teaching positions (Cluj-Napoca, Bucureşti, Iaşi, Sibiu, Baia Mare, Arad, Oradea, Târgu Mureş).
- He has held conferences and grammar lessons abroad as follows: Aix-En-Provence University, France, 2008; Sapienza University of Rome, Italy, 2008, 2009, 2010; European Community, Luxembourg (The Center of Romanian Translators), 2011.
